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Parent Information / Parent Forum.

We consulted with parents about bringing in sweets for children’s birthdays via the app. The result of this was:

Therefore in response to parent/carer views we will continue to allow this for the time being. This will be drawn to the attention of the Parent Forum early next term as part of our Healthy Lifestyles project.

You asked us if parents could be invited to the class assemblies and we will be inviting parents next year, details will follow after the break.

Thank you to those parents, grandparents and carers who attended the Parent Forum this week. It was very well attended and some really good points were raised and ideas put forward. We will be holding another meeting like this (with coffee and cake!) in September and hope you will join us.

Key ideas discussed:

Issues with parking – it was discussed that parents and carers really need to treat each other with respect and be much more careful as currently use of this area can be extremely challenging. Please remember that children are at risk from dangerous parking and driving.

Changes to the start of the school day should help with this:

- 8.35am KS2 children can come into the KS2 playground
- 8.40am onwards children in Year 1 and 2 can come into school through the back door (back of the Reception class)
- 8.55am Reception children can come into school via the front of the Reception class

More school community events have been requested – we would like suggestions for this please. Our first events will be the meet the teacher sessions in September with an early Parent Forum and open afternoon.

Raising the profile of success is really important for both pupils and families. The Marvellous Me app is a key support for this. If you haven't used it yet, give it a try. Any queries please speak to the office. Adrian will be available on 8th September to support parents and carers in downloading and using.

As a school we would like to know your ideas and concerns. It is often difficult when parents do not tell us of issues and things which could be improved. Please come and tell us or email into school so that we can address things quickly. Parents have told us that they hear people complaining but many get frustrated that these issues are not passed to us and are discussed only on the playground. We developed the Parent Forum as a means by

which people could share their ‘moans’ so that these could be addressed. It is always fantastic to hear our parents and families saying positive things to other people and supporting their child’s school.
